The Importance of Making Time

To say that there is a lot going on right now would be an understatement. As adults and parents, you deal with your job, your house, your kids, and everything else that comes with adulthood. And while you may have routines and systems to help you manage your time, kids have not had that training yet. They may hear it in passing from their teachers; the importance of filling out a planner, thinking ahead, taking time to practice.

We know how important managing our time is, especially now. Here a few tips to share with your kids (and we will too in class) about how to use their time effectively.

 Have a Plan: mapping out your schedule and how you will use your time is essential. It is the foundation of all other time management strategies. A good plan will include your long term goals, specific times and dates, and a list of tasks you need to complete daily, weekly, and monthly.

- 2. Priorities: by understanding that some tasks are more important, it allows you to relieve some of the stress in your day. Once those top priorities are accomplished, you can move on to other things without the reminder that there is something else you have to do. Choose the tasks that most align with your goals and make sure they get done!
- 3. Asking for Help: You don't have to do all of this alone. We are constantly telling our students to ask for help because they want to do it alone. There are tasks that are difficult and require a helping hand or clarification. There is nothing wrong with asking for someone to lend a hand.

While these are just a few things to keep in mind, sharing and showing these to your students can make a world of difference. As musicians, it's important to set time aside everyday to practice. College level musicians are expected to practice 4-5 hours per day. Without proper planning, setting priorities, and seeking out help, the chances of growing and performing at a high level are extremely low. So please, help your students manage their time and find a place to work on their instrument. You will be impressed with their growth, both musically and academically.
